REPORT FOR SECOND QUARTER 2014 AND THE FIRST HALF YEAR 2014

Comments to the accounts for Bonheur ASA

The unaudited group accounts for 2 quarter 2014 comprise Bonheur ASA and its subsidiaries ("The Group of companies") and the Group of companies' ownership of associates.

Comparable figures for the corresponding periods in 2013 in brackets.

Highlights 2Q 2014:

- Operating revenues were NOK 2 771 million (NOK 2 607 million)
- Operating result before depreciation (EBITDA) was NOK 845 million (NOK 1 138 million)
- Operating result (EBIT) was NOK 158 million (NOK 642 million)
- Net result after tax was NOK 130 million (NOK 550 million)
- Earnings per share were NOK 1.9 (NOK 8.4)

Post quarter:

- Completed two senior unsecured bond issues of NOK 900 million and NOK 600 million, with maturities in 2019 and 2021, respectively



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Financial information

As a consequence of Bonheur ASA holding more than 50% of the shares of Ganger Rolf ASA, Ganger Rolf ASA is fully consolidated for accounting purposes as a subsidiary of Bonheur ASA. As Bonheur ASA and Ganger Rolf ASA have a joint ownership (50% / 50%) of their major investments, the ownership structure entails full consolidation for accounting purposes of a number of companies. The main business segments comprise Offshore drilling, Renewable energy, Shipping / Offshore wind, Cruise and Other investments.

Following the acquisition of Fred. Olsen Production ASA on 20 December 2013 by Yinson Production Ltd., the business segment Floating Production is presented as discontinued operations in the comparable 2013 figures in the income statement.

1) The non-controlling interests mainly consist of 47,74% of Fred. Olsen Energy ASA (FOE), 37.01% of Ganger Rolf ASA and 44.06% of NHST Media Group AS.

The Group of companies' operating revenues amounted to NOK 2 771 million (NOK 2 607 million) in the quarter. Offshore Drilling had operating revenues of NOK 1 638 million (NOK 1 788 million), Renewable Energy NOK 116 million (NOK 138 million), Shipping / Offshore wind NOK 405 million (NOK 330 million), Cruise NOK 377 million (NOK 340 million) and Other investments NOK 235 million (NOK 10 million).

NHST Media Group has from May 2014 been fully consolidated in Bonheur ASA, following the increase in ownership from 35.6% to 54.0%. The segment Other investments obtained increased revenues of NOK 225 million, of which NOK 220 million is related to two months revenues of NHST Media Group. For further information see note 7. Total revenues have been positively impacted by higher USD, GBP and EUR against NOK compared with the corresponding quarter last year. USD was on average approximately 3% higher in 2 quarter 2014 compared to 2 quarter 2013, while GBP and EUR, respectively, were 12% and 8% higher.

Operating result before depreciation (EBITDA) in the quarter was NOK 845 million (NOK 1 138 million). The decrease from corresponding period last year of NOK 293 million is mainly due to lower EBITDA within Offshore drilling which achieved EBITDA in the quarter of NOK 639 million (NOK 935 million), within Renewable energy which achieved NOK 68 million (NOK 94 million) and Cruise which achieved NOK - 8 million (NOK 9 million). This was partly offset by increased EBITDA within Shipping / Offshore wind which had EBITDA of NOK 158 million (NOK 127 million) and within Other investments which achieved an improvement of NOK 15 million in the quarter.

Depreciation in the quarter was NOK 687 million (NOK 496 million).

Operating result (EBIT) was NOK 158 million (NOK 642 million).



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Net financial items were NOK - 73 million (NOK 166 million). Net interest expenses in the quarter were NOK 147 million (NOK 123 million) and net currency gain was NOK 95 million (gain NOK 137 million). Net unrealized loss related to fair value adjustment of financial instruments was NOK - 10 million (gain of NOK 109 million). No dividends were received during the quarter, while a dividend of NOK 65 million from IT Fornebu Properties AS (now named Koksa Eiendom AS) was received in 2 quarter 2013.

Net result in the quarter was NOK 130 million (NOK 550 million), of which NOK 63 million relates to the majority interests (NOK 273 million). The non-controlling interests' share of net result in the quarter was NOK 67 million (NOK 276 million).

Revenues year to date were NOK 5 471 million (NOK 4 870 million) while EBITDA year to date were NOK 1 720 million (NOK 1 978 million). Operating result (EBIT) year to date was NOK 504 million (NOK 1 010 million). Net financial items were NOK - 245 million (NOK 125 million) and net result after estimated tax from continuing operations was NOK 262 million (NOK 1 094 million). Net result after tax and discontinued operations was NOK 262 million (NOK 869 million), of which NOK 112 million (NOK 352 million) relate to the majority interests

Business segments

The Group of companies' results for the individual business segments are included in Note 3.

In the following, it is referred to the Group of companies' consolidated business segments presented on 100% basis. Bonheur ASA and Ganger Rolf ASA have an ownership of 50% each in these segments unless otherwise stated.

Offshore Drilling

The segment consists of 51.9% ownership of Fred. Olsen Energy ASA with subsidiaries (FOE). Figures below are presented in NOK as consolidated into Bonheur ASA and Ganger Rolf ASA.

“FINANCIAL INFORMATION (*1st quarter 2014 and first half year 2013 in brackets*)

Operating revenues in the quarter were 273 million (278 million), a decrease of 5 million compared with the previous quarter. The revenues for offshore drilling division were 265 million, compared to 267 million previous quarter. The decrease in revenues within the offshore drilling division is mainly due to Bideford Dolphin being at yard for most of the quarter partly offset by start-up for Bolette Dolphin in the quarter. Revenues within the engineering and fabrication division were 24 million (48 million), of which 16 million (38 million) were related to intra-group activities.

Operating costs were 167 million (176 million), a decrease of 9 million compared with previous quarter. Operating costs within the offshore drilling division decreased by 6 million. Operating costs within the engineering and fabrication division were 19 million (44 million), of which 9 million (32 million) were related to intra-group activities.

Operating profit before depreciation (EBITDA) was 107 million (102 million). EBITDA for the half year was 209 million (301 million).

Depreciation amounted to 88 million (63 million). The increase is due to full depreciation of Bolette Dolphin and extraordinary depreciation for Blackford Dolphin and Borgholm Dolphin in connection with replacement of equipment at the yard stays. For the half year it amounted to 150 million (122 million).

Operating profit after depreciation (EBIT) was 19 million (39 million). EBIT for the half year was 58 million (179 million).

Net financial expenses were 2 million (15 million). Capitalized interest expenses related to the newbuild in the quarter amounted to 2 million (3 million). Net financial expenses for the half year were 17 million (1 million).

Profit before tax was 16 million (25 million). Profit before tax for the half year was 41 million (178 million).

Net profit, including an estimated tax charge of 9 million (1 million), was 7 million (24 million). Net profit for the half year, including an estimated tax charge of 10 million (8 million), was 31 million (170 million).

Basic earnings per share were 0.10 (0.35).

Basic earnings per share for the half year were 0.45 (2.56).”



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Renewable Energy

Renewable Energy consists of 100% ownership of Fred. Olsen Renewables AS with subsidiaries (FOR).

FOR owns and operates seven wind farms, of which six wind farms in Scotland (Crystal Rig, Crystal Rig II, Rothes, Rothes II, Paul's Hill and Mid Hill) and one in Norway (Lista). As of 30 June 2014 FOR had an installed capacity of 486 MW in production. In addition FOR has a portfolio of development projects onshore in the UK, Norway and Sweden as well as offshore Ireland.

Operating revenues in the quarter were NOK 116 million (NOK 138 million). The decrease from the corresponding quarter last year is mainly caused by lower wind speed and also lower electricity prices. This is partly offset by higher installed capacity (Mid Hill) and 12.5% higher GBP/NOK exchange rate. Despite higher capacity, the generation decreased from 224 GWh in 2 quarter last year to 185 GWh in 2 quarter 2014. EBITDA were NOK 68 million (NOK 94 million).

For the first half year, FOR had operating revenues of NOK 396 million (NOK 297 million). The generation increased from 480 GWh to 610 GWh, mainly due to higher installed capacity and high wind speeds in 1 quarter 2014. EBITDA were NOK 288 million (NOK 206 million).

Shipping / Offshore wind

As per end of the quarter the segment consists of Fred. Olsen Windcarrier AS, a company providing transport and installation services for the offshore wind industry and Universal Foundation Norway AS, a company offering innovative offshore wind turbine foundations. Both companies are indirectly owned 100% through Fred. Olsen Ocean Limited (formerly named First Olsen Limited). Fred. Olsen Windcarrier AS owns 51% of Global Wind Service A/S, an international supplier of qualified and skilled personnel to the global wind turbine industry. Fred. Olsen Windcarrier AS and Global Wind Service A/S each own 50% of Fred. Olsen Windcarrier Denmark A/S.

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Operating revenues in the quarter were NOK 405 million against NOK 330 million for the same period in 2013. The strengthening of the Euro against Norwegian Kroner (from 7.62 to 8.21) contributes to NOK 30 million of the total increase of NOK 75 million.

Operating result before depreciation (EBITDA) for the quarter was NOK 158 million, an increase of NOK 31 million compared to 2 quarter 2013, which also includes a gain of NOK 15 million on the sale of the suezmax tanker "Knock Clune".

Revenues for the first half year were NOK 705 million compared to NOK 452 million for the first half year in 2013. The increased revenues are related to the operations of the two offshore jack-up installation vessels "Brave Tern" and "Bold Tern" in 2014. EBITDA year to date were NOK 215 million, compared to NOK 94 million per 2 quarter 2013.

The installation vessels have in the quarter been engaged on projects in German waters for transportation and installation of wind turbines. Both vessels will complete their current projects during 3 quarter and will commence new projects in UK and German waters, respectively.

Global Wind Service A/S, a Danish limited company owned 51% by Fred. Olsen Windcarrier AS, is an international supplier of qualified and skilled personnel to the global wind turbine industry. The company provides a wide range of installation and maintenance services.

Fred. Olsen Windcarrier Denmark A/S, a Danish subsidiary of Fred. Olsen Windcarrier AS, operates a fleet of 8 high-speed vessels built for safe and efficient transport of goods and personnel to and from offshore wind farms. All vessels are at the end of the quarter engaged on projects with durations varying from 2 months to 3 years.

Universal Foundation Norway AS, a Fred. Olsen Ocean Ltd subsidiary, delivers integrated projects to the offshore wind industry based on the innovative Universal Foundation 'suction bucket' foundation for wind turbines and meteorological masts. In May 2014 Universal Foundation A/S, a Danish subsidiary of Universal Foundation Norway AS, in close co-operation with Aalborg University, entered into a contract with Statoil as lead partner in the Carbon Trust's Offshore Wind Accelerator program, for multiple installation trials of the Universal Foundation 'suction bucket' offshore wind foundation on future development sites in UK waters.

Cruise

Cruise consists of 100% indirect ownership of Fred. Olsen Cruise Lines Ltd, with subsidiaries (FOCL), located in the UK.

FOCL owns and operates four cruise ships, MV Black Watch, MV Braemar, MV Boudicca, and MV Balmoral.

Operating revenues in the quarter were NOK 377 million (NOK 340 million). Operating result before depreciation (EBITDA) was NOK - 8 million (NOK 9 million).



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The UK cruise market's weak economic conditions continued to result in lower sales. The number of passenger days totaled 274 605 (316 468) for the quarter. Net ticket income per diem was 3% lower compared to the corresponding quarter last year. The average spot price of fuel oil in the quarter was 6% higher than in 2 quarter 2013.

For the first half year, FOCL had operating revenues of NOK 795 million (NOK 726 million). EBITDA were NOK 7 million (NOK 10 million).

Other investments

Other Investments mainly consist of an ownership of 54.0% of NHST Media Group AS, 12.6% of Koksa Eiendom AS (previously IT Fornebu Properties AS) as well as 100% of the service companies, Fred. Olsen Insurance Services AS, Fred. Olsen Travel AS, AS Fred. Olsen Fly- og Luftmateriell and FO Capital Ltd.

NHST Media Group AS

Up until 9 May 2014, Bonheur ASA and Ganger Rolf ASA owned in total 35.6% of NHST Media Group AS. An additional 236 988 shares were purchased by the two companies on 9 May 2014, such that the combined ownership increased to 54.0%.

NHST Media Group AS have four main business segments, Dagens Næringsliv (newspaper for business), Digital & Nordic (TDN, Europower, Smartcom, MyNewsdesk, ddp direct), Global (Tradewinds, Upstream, Intrafish, Events and Recharge) and Nautical Charts.

NHST Media Group AS achieved a turnover of NOK 324 million in the quarter (NOK 329 million). This corresponds to a decrease of 2% mainly due to an 8% decline in revenues from advertisements compared to last year. The market share and number of copies sold for most of the publications has in total been quite stable. The growth in demand for the digital products continues with an increased turnover of 8% compared to 2 quarter 2013.

The result before depreciation (EBITDA) for the quarter was NOK 34 million (NOK 39).

Koksa Eiendom AS (previously IT Fornebu Properties AS)

Bonheur ASA and Ganger Rolf ASA each holds 6.3% of the shares in Koksa Eiendom AS (KE).

KE holds 30% of the shares of Martin Linges vei 33 AS which consists of the building built for Statoil's regional office in Oslo and the connected underground parking facility.

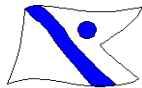
The Nordic hotel group Scandic rents and operates the hotel (owned by Fornebu Hotel AS) which was finished in September 2012 and is situated next to the new office building of Statoil. KE holds 50% of the shares in the company owning the hotel and related parking facilities.

Other information

Capital and financing

During the first half year investments were mainly related to Offshore Drilling (FOE) and Renewable Energy (FOR).

Within FOE, capital expenditures amounted to NOK 4 161 million, related to delivery of new build, class renewal surveys and general upgrades.



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FOR had capital expenditures of NOK 420 million, mainly related to the construction of Mid Hill wind farm, and pre-construction activities on windfarms in Norway, Sweden and Scotland.

In total the Group of companies' investments in Property, plant and equipment amounted to NOK 4 615 million in the first half year of 2014.

In the 2 quarter, the Group of companies increased its shareholding in NHST Media Group, by purchasing 236 988 additional shares, a total investment of NOK 91 million.

Gross interest bearing debt of the Group of companies as per end of 2 quarter was NOK 16 785 million, an increase of NOK 4 243 million since year end 2013. Cash and cash equivalents amounted to NOK 5 862 million, an increase of NOK 483 million since year end 2013. Net interest bearing debt of the Group of companies per 2 quarter 2014 was NOK 10 923 million, an increase of NOK 3 761 million since year end 2013. The equity to asset ratio was 35% compared with 40% at year-end 2013.

Subsequent events

Bonheur ASA has successfully completed a NOK 900 million senior unsecured bond issue with maturity in 2019 and a NOK 600 million senior unsecured bond issue with maturity in 2021. Ganger Rolf ASA is guarantor for both issues. Settlement date was 9 July 2014. Applications will be made for listing of the bonds on Oslo Stock Exchange. Net proceeds from the bond issues will be used for refinancing of existing debt, including the NOK 1 000 million outstanding under the BON01 bond issue with ISIN NO 0010560683 and maturity on 15 December 2014, and for general corporate purposes. Ganger Rolf ASA has borrowed 50% of the proceeds from the bond issues from Bonheur ASA at identical terms.

Dividend / Annual General Meeting in Bonheur ASA

At the Annual General Meeting in Bonheur ASA on 28 May 2014, the proposed dividend payment of NOK 7.00 per share was approved. The dividend was paid on 25 June, amounting to NOK 285.5 million in total.

Statement by the Board of Directors and the Managing Director

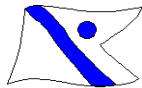

Note 1 – Basis of presentation

Introduction

The Group accounts for the second quarter 2014 comprise Bonheur ASA and its subsidiaries (“The Group of companies”) and the shares of associates. The quarterly accounts of 2014 and the Group of companies’ accounts for 2013 may be obtained by contacting Fred. Olsen & Co., Oslo, or at www.bonheur.net

Financial framework and accounting principles

The interim accounts have been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 as adopted by EU and the Securities and Trading Act. The accounts do not include all information required for annual accounts and should be read in conjunction with the Group of company’s annual accounts for 2013 and the previous interim reports issued in 2014. The interim financial report for the second quarter 2014 was approved by the company’s board on 16 July 2014.

The accounting principles applied by the Group of companies in these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied by the Group of companies in its consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2013 with the exception of adoption of IFRS10, IFRS 11, IFRS 12, IAS 27 (amended) and IAS 28 (amended). The adopted standards do not have a significant impact on the condensed interim consolidated financial statements of the Company.

Estimates

The preparation of interim accounts involves the use of appraisals, estimates and assumptions influencing the amounts stated for assets and obligations, revenues and costs. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The most important appraisals when applying the Group accounting principles and the primary sources of estimate uncertainties are the same for the preparation of interim accounts as for the 2013 Group accounts.

Note 2 – Property, plant and equipment – investments and disposals

In April 2011 a subsidiary of Fred. Olsen Energy ASA ordered a new ultra deepwater drillship at Hyundai Heavy Industries Co., Ltd. shipyard in Korea. The vessel was scheduled to be delivered at a total cost of USD 615 million (including spare parts, owner furnished equipment and project team). The delivery date was 21 February 2014 and the total capitalized construction cost is USD 655 million.

In May 2012 a subsidiary of Fred. Olsen Energy ASA entered into a turnkey contract with Hyundai Heavy Industries Co., Ltd. for the building of a harsh environment ultra deep water semi-submersible drilling rig with scheduled delivery in March 2015. Total project cost is estimated to USD 700 million (including spare parts, owner furnished equipment and yard project team). Per 30 June 2014 the total capitalized construction cost is USD 441 million.

On 2 April 2014, Fred Olsen Ocean Ltd., which is owned 50/50 by Bonheur ASA and Ganger Rolf ASA, entered into an agreement for sale of the suezmax tanker “Knock Clune”. The vessel was delivered to the buyer in the second quarter 2014. The sale produced a book gain of approximately USD 2.7 million.

Note 4 – Interest bearing loans

FOE has repaid USD 94.4 million of the credit facility as per 30 June 2014.

FOE has borrowed USD 783.6 million during 1st half year 2014, including a new bond loan of NOK 1 100 million. The bond was raised in the Norwegian bond market at a coupon of 3 months libor + 3.0%, with maturity in February 2019.

At the end of the second quarter, FOE signed a new six year bank credit facility of up to USD 2,000 million. The credit facility will be used to repay existing bank loan in Q3, full-finance the newbuild Bollsta Dolphin and for general corporate purposes.

FOR has secured bank loans of GBP 322 million, finance lease liabilities of GBP 39 million and other interest bearing loans of GBP 5 million as per 30 June 2014.

FOCL has secured bank loans of GBP 68 million as per 30 June 2014.

FOL has bank loans of EUR 143 million outstanding as per 30 June 2014 which relate to Fred. Olsen Windcarrier AS and Universal Foundation AS.

In December 2009 Bonheur ASA completed a NOK 1,000 million 5 years unsecured bond issue with Ganger Rolf ASA as guarantor. Maturity date is 15th December 2014. Ganger Rolf ASA has borrowed NOK 500 million of the proceeds from the bond issue from Bonheur ASA at identical terms.

In January 2012 Bonheur ASA completed a NOK 700 million 5 years unsecured bond issue with maturity in 2017 and a NOK 300 million 7 years bond issue with maturity in 2019. Ganger Rolf ASA has borrowed NOK 350 million and NOK 150 million, respectively, of the proceeds from the bond issues from Bonheur ASA at identical terms.

On 26 June 2014 Bonheur ASA successfully completed a NOK 900 million senior unsecured bond issue with maturity in 2019 and a NOK 600 million senior unsecured bond issue with maturity in 2021. Ganger Rolf ASA is guarantor for both issues. Settlement date is 9 July 2014. Net proceeds from the bond issues will be used for refinancing of existing debt, including the NOK 1,000 million outstanding bond issue with maturity on 15 December 2014, and for general corporate purposes. Ganger Rolf ASA has borrowed 50% of the proceeds from both bond issues from Bonheur ASA at identical terms.

Note 5 – Taxes

There are several ongoing tax disputes between subsidiaries within the Group of companies and the Norwegian tax authorities. For further information please refer to Note 28 in the Annual Report for 2013 and Note 5 in the 1st quarter report for 2014. No additional issues have occurred.

Note 6 – Discontinued operations

In June 2013, Yinson Holdings Berhad, announced a cash offer to acquire 100% of the shares in Fred. Olsen Production ASA (FOP). Fred. Olsen Ocean Ltd. (Formerly named First Olsen Ltd), owned 50/50 by Bonheur ASA and Ganger Rolf ASA, and the majority shareholder of FOP, granted the offeror an irrevocable pre-acceptance for its 65 191 200 shares, representing 61.54% of the total issued shares and votes of FOP.

As a consequence of the above mentioned cash offer, the business segment Floating Production were classified as held for sale in the consolidated financial position with effect from 30. June 2013, and accordingly presented as discontinued operations in the consolidated income statement. On 20th December 2013, FOP announced that settlement of the voluntary offer by Yinson to acquire all outstanding shares in FOP had been completed.

Note 7 – Acquisition of subsidiary

On 9 May 2014, the Group of companies acquired 18.4 % of the shares and voting interests in NHST Media Group (NHST). As a result, the Group of companies' equity interest in NHST increased from 35.6 to 54%.

Following this acquisition the Group of companies will continue its participation in the development of NHST in today's challenging media environment.

NHST is a Norwegian media conglomerate that publishes a number of newspapers and online tools. Among its newspapers is Dagens Næringsliv, a Norwegian business daily ranking among Norway's largest printed newspapers. The newspaper dates back to 1889.

For accounting purposes NHST is fully consolidated from 1 May 2014. In the two months to 30 June 2014, NHST contributed revenue of NOK 220 million and net result after tax of NOK 19 million to the Group of companies' results. If the acquisition had occurred on 1 January 2014, management estimates that consolidated revenue would have been NOK 623 million, and consolidated net result after tax for the period would have been NOK 9 million. The reported amounts are in accordance with IFRS.
